## ART

7th graders are finishing the year with Linocut printmaking and architectural letters.


8th graders worked on a Still Life drawing with Oil Pastels and a Paper, Lace Layers design.


## 7th Grade Science

Second Semester 7th grade Science students have been hard at work creating their group paper roller coasters in class. They were also challenged with their final summative for the year-Rube Goldberg Machines created at home. Their Rube Goldberg Machine performs a simple task, through a series of chain reactions and energy transformations, that they could do easier on their own. Students have submitted a variety of machines including giving their dogs a treat, closing a door, catching a critter and more. One of my favorite machines used the elastic straps on the student's face mask to slingshot a ball to start their chain reaction. Way to go $7^{\text {th }}$ graders-you rose to the task at hand and smashed it.



## 7th Grade Math

Mrs. Gieseke's 7th grade math classes ended the year with Geometry and Statistics units. Students specifically learned about angle measures, cross sections, volume, and surface area. Pictured are students making playdough models of 3D objects to slice and examine cross sections. We are finishing out the year learning about the probability of events occurring. Pictured are students spinning a spinner to compare theoretical probability, what should happen in theory, to experimental probability, what actually happened in the experiment. They found that relative frequency, the more times they spun the spinner, resulted in the experimental probability approaching the theoretical probability.


## 7th Grade ELA

7th grade ELA students are wrapping up a unit on the Holocaust, where they read the book Prisoner B-3087by Alan Gratz. Students began the unit with an informational webquest to build background knowledge of the time period. The book, Prisoner B-3087is an astounding true story of survival for Yanek Gruener, a Jewish boy at the mercy of the Nazis who had taken over Poland in 1939. Yanek is then sent to 10 different Concentration Camps where he is faced with death on a daily basis and must fight to survive. Students created an annotated timeline of Yanek's experience so they could fully comprehend the brutality Yanek and others endured during the Holocaust. Students will end the year with a scrapbook project containing the trials and tribulations of this school year as well as set goals for next year.

## Social Studies Update:

In the final weeks of the 2020-21 school year lots of great activities and work has been going on in the social studies department.
6th-grade social studies have been studying the following:

- Three Federal Branches of the U.S. Government, Bill of Rights, and Checks and Balances.
- Ancient Greece - Mythology, Athens vs. Sparta, and Alexander the Great.
- We will finish up with the Roman Empire - Geography, Emperors, Legions, and Virtual Tour of Rome.

7th graders in world studies have been working on studying the feudalism system. They constructed their own manors and family heraldry as well as miniature catapults.


8th graders have been focusing on learning about historic civic action groups such as the Abolitionist, Women's Suffrage, Labor, and Temperance movements and the actions they used to reach their goals of social and political change. This semester's activities have included a lifesize game of Clue to decide what protest has occurred, a parade with student created women's suffrage sashes, an Underground Railroad investigation and interactive simulation to discover who was a secret conductor and abolitionist, famous painting reenactments, and the colonists putting King George on trial.



The social studies department has also been actively collecting more research and collaborating with several community groups about our PBL: Lost Voices - the Curry Institute of Urbana. After students developed the idea, Urbana Junior High School was successfully able to donate a beautiful portrait of Dr. EWB Curry, created by our junior high art teacher Mandy Parker, to the Champaign County Historical Museum. We have also been in contact with the owner of the Gaslight Auto Company to confirm and visit the location of the Curry Farm School that students have researched. Recently, we also were able to meet with the curator of the Delaware County Historical Society, Benny Shoults, to coordinate our efforts and plans for next year's projects as well as the installment of historical markers in both counties.


The social studies department would also like to thank our two student teachers, Mr. Shane Souders and Mr. Michael Stroud, for all of their creative input, efforts, and support of students this school year. We wish them the best of luck in all of their future endeavors!

## 8th Grade Science

Students are beginning a science and social studies collaborative project in class. After selecting their "job" students will prepare a product in an effort to promote and support our local nature preservation, Cedar Bog.

## 6th Grade ELA

In 6th grade ELA students have been discovering new word roots. Each week, students learn 5 new roots and 25 new words. Students have been using interactive cut outs and root cards to practice learning this new information. They also write the definition of the word so they have something to study. We have an assessment after 5 roots, and the students recall definitions of words we learned. The ultimate goal is that students will be able to figure out the definitions of words they may not know because they know the root of the word. We are finishing up our unit on Esperanza Rising. Students have taken assessments over every two chapters. We are learning about Esperanza's life after her father passes away. Through this character study, students can see that through trials and tribulations, a person is able to persevere and "come out on top".


## 6th grade Health

As we finish the year with both our swap classes and our semester classes we have been challenging our students to work on and improve their social skills and how to be assertive in many different ways. We have given them challenges to say Hi to people they don't know in school and how to give compliments to others. We have also worked on scripts of how to say no by using those assertive phrases to help them get what they want. We hope that all of the health students continue to work on the Life Skills that we have taught them over the summer and when they head into 7th grade.

## 6th Grade Math

6th Grade Math is finishing the year up by working on their Statistical PBL Project over healthy lifestyle choices. Students are having to research a statistical question, collect the data, and make a final presentation to display for the community to see. Students are researching a wide variety of questions, from how much sleep a 6th-grade student should get, to how many times a 6th-grade student lies in a day.

## Computer Science Discoveries 2

## CS- Cash

Students have been using lots of skills in CS classes this semester.
The 7TH CSD class created web pages using html and css language. Web pages covered topics like the color orange and ways to cope with stress as well as personal interests and hobbies.


And we also started learning how to use game lab by creating animated scenes. Students learned how to create and animate sprites using block coding.

6TH grade has used block coding and problem solving to design build and code trick shots for the spheros. The attached document has links to videos of the finished projects mrs-cash.org

## Career Exploration - Mrs. Flowers

Career Exploration students have been using the Future Ready Find Your Grind curriculum to explore careers and determine their individual career interests. Each week students watch a video, complete a challenge and reflect on the lesson. Each week provides students an opportunity to dig deeper into their personal interests and challenges them to set goals that are SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Timely). Students are currently creating Google Slides presentations of their SMART goals in four areas (Relationships, Education, Finance and Future Career Goals). They identified something of interest to them and then the class circulated around the room to brainstorm career possibilities based upon that interest.
