

The current 7th grade World Studies students used the online program "Storyboard That" to create graphic novels about the Black Plague. Students really enjoyed the ability to use their own creativity and the amazing technical capabilities of the program to bring the story of the Black Plague to life!





### 8th Grade

So far 2nd semester American History students have participated in a plethora of activities including dressing up staff members to symbolize the process our government takes for a bill to become a law, re-enacting popular uses of first amendment rights by historical civic actions groups including walking in a women's suffrage march and utilizing child labor picket signs, and participating in a simulation demonstrating how fear and societal expectations can play a role in creating an atmosphere where events like the Salem Witch Trials can unfold. We are now moving into early colonial history with colonist frustrations causing the American Revolution to build up.














### 6th Grade

During the third quarter, my students successfully completed our Project Based Learning unit on Dr. E.W.B. Curry by researching and writing an informative paragraph about his family life, educational upbringing, academic accomplishments, and his long term cultural effects on Urbana, Ohio.





During the beginning of fourth quarter, our class began a unit on Economics. The students focused on learning about and understanding key economic concepts of capitalism, supply and demand, production, consumerism, and entrepreneurship. The culminating unit activity was the students successfully creating an opinion-based paragraph about their future career selection after interpreting economic data provided by the U.S. Bureau of Labor.





### 6th Grade ELA

We have been working hard in Wit and Wisdom, completing two books: Out of the Dust and Bud, Not Buddy. The students seemed to really enjoy both books, and we have had great conversations. Students are working on using the ToSEEC format to answer questions and prepare essays. In my class, students' writing has improved so much. I am very proud of my students.

Since September, I have had a Student of the Month in all of my classes. These are exceptional students! They have maintained good grades, have good attendance, and have not had behavior issues.

#### 7th Grade ELA

7th grade ELA is currently studying the World War II experiences of Japanese Americans and Native Americans. In this, "Americans All" unit students are reading *Code Talker* by Joseph Bruchac and *Farewell to Manzanar* by Jeanne Wakatsuki Houston. Students are exploring how people react when faced with war. They have learned how war impacted Americans in different ways. During this module, students are also learning about the techniques of informative writing. Combining their historical knowledge with their understanding of informative writing, the students will write an informative essay using one of our texts to explain how World War II affected individuals.
